#### • Name Shimon bar Jonah (Simon, son of John) Jesus renamed him Peter • Matthew 16:17, John 1:42 • Aramaic: Kepahs (حمحه) Places associated Birthplace: Bethsaida (John 1:44) Settled: Capernaum Martyred: Rome (64 AD) Other Common Information: Occupation: Fisherman Education: uneducated (Acts 4:13)

• Partners: St. James and St. John (sons of Zebedee)

Family

- Wife (1 Corinthians 9:5, 1 Peter 5:13)
- Mother-in-Law (Matthew 8:14–15, Mark 1:29–31, and Luke 4:38–39)
  Spiritual Son: St. Mark

• Age

 Probably around the same age as Jesus or older Shimon to Peter

- Shimon "shama" (Hebrew, v.) "to hear" / "to listen"
  - Shimon means: "He has heard" or "God has heard"
  - "Shema Yisrael, Adonai Eloheinu, Adonai Echad" –
     "Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord is One." (Deuteronomy 6:4)

Jesus gives Simon the name Peter

- Peter from Greek Petros (Πέτρος) rock/stone
- New Testament Greek manuscripts used Petros
- Except: St. Paul used the Hellenization the Aramaic Kephas to Cephas (Κηφᾶς)
  - 1 Corinthians
    - 1 Corinthians 1:12, 3:22, 9:5, and 15:5
  - Galatians
    - Galatians 1:18, 2:9, and 2:11-14

Kephas to Petros

 Kephas (Aramaic: حمح) - Rock/Stone • <sup>((k-f-h<sup>3</sup>)</sup> (כ-פ-א) - Proto-Seminic (PS) solidity/firmness/strength/stone/stability /foundational and examples on derivatives Hebrew: Kefa (בַּפָה) – rock/stone • Arabic: Kifah (كِفَاح) – "struggle", "fight", "strength" • Syriac: Kepha (<>>>) – dialect of Aramaic, means rock/stone • Ancient Ge'ez (Ethiopic): Käffa (h4) – solid objects Petros (Greek: Πέτρος) – Rock/Stone
 "\*petr-" - Proto-Indo-European Language (PIE) Same meaning as in PS and examples of derivatives: • Sanscrit: parvata (पर्वत) – mountain **Greek: petra (π**έτρα) – rock Latin: petro – rock/stone -> Petrus

St. Peter during Jesus' Ministry  Travelled with Jesus from Galilee, to Judea, and up to Ceasarea Philippi Spokesperson for the Apostles Paradoxical Biblical Characterizations Confident vs Coward Loyal vs Denier **Trusting vs Doubting** Leader vs Follower

#### And yet

- Jesus always saves and restores St. Peter.
- Jesus entrusted him the Keys of Heaven
  - the power to bind and loose in Earth and Heaven

### Martyrdom of St. Peter

•63 AD – Burning of Rome charged against Christians Appian Way incident / "Quo vadis" legend Ties in with the prophecy in John 21:19 on St. Peter's death

•Upside-down crucifixion at the Circus on Vatican Hills Holiness of St. Peter Recognition of our frailties and our need for Jesus' salvation
Humble Leadership
Perfect Obedience

# St. Peter in the Legion of Mary Handbook
