- are lead to Jesus through John the Baptist's revelations


Profound closeness & intimacy

The Crucifixion


- John consoles Mary at the Crucifixion

The Empty Tomb


- St. John's excitement on receiving Mary Magdelene's news of the open Tomb.
- On arrival at the Tomb, his deferral to St.
 Peter"s seniority and his following him into the Tomb.



John's Special Roles

Role in the Post-Resurrection Church

- Leadership of the early Church in Jerusalem, with St. Peter & St. James
- St. Peter and St. John affirmed Paul's ministry to the non Jewish world!
- John's steadfastness and spiritual insight guide the Church growth and persecution.



John's Persecution & Miraculous Survival

Persecution

- Persecution under the Roman Emperor Domitian.
- Torture, including being thrown into a cauldron of boiling oil, from which he miraculously emerged unharmed.
- A divinely protected apostle
- A powerful witness to his faith.



Exiled to the island of Patmos

- Intended as a punishment, became a period of profound spiritual revelation
- He received the visions which he recorded in the Book of Revelation
- Saint John survived all the other apostles and was the only one who did not die as a martyr
- He was compared to the Eagle in his keen vision of God's infinite love for the world



Words of Wisdom: The Writings of St. John 1

The Gospel of John:

- V. Mother Mary of Jesus of Agreda in her "City of God" wrote much on St. John
- The Gospel was written after the assumption of the Most Blessed Mary, under Mary's guidance
- It's arguments for the true Divinity of Christ, far surpass that of the other Evangelists



Words of Wisdom: The Writings of St. John 2 The Gospel of John:

- "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (John 1:1)
- Portrayal of Jesus as the eternal Logos, emphasizing his divinity and pre-existence
- It was written under the direct guidance of the Blessed Virgin

Words of Wisdom The Writings of St. John 3 The Epistles of John:


- Focuses on themes of love, truth, and fellowship.
- Love as defining the Christian community
- He addresses issues such as false teachings,
- Living in accordance with God's commandments
- Loving one another as evidence of true faith. 14



Words of Wisdom The Writings of St. John 4 The Book of Revelation

- This apocalyptic text written during his exile on Patmos, offers a vision of the end times,
- A vision of the ultimate triumph of good over evil.
- a message of hope and encouragement to persecuted Christians
- assuring them of God's ultimate victory and the establishment of His kingdom.

- John's miraculous survival of torture




Accounts of Heroic Courage 2

Conservation


